The top has numerous crack repairs: all are stable with tidy interior cleats and professionally done many years ago. Top has been over-sprayed. The rest of instrument is original lacquer. I converted the bridge to a 12 hole tie-block to recapture down-bearing to permit lowering the saddle. This is a thoroughly playable and great sounding 50 year old guitar at a very reasonable price.
